Messier 38

This Meridian looks a little sparse, so I'll include an image I took of M38 while waiting for Orion to clear trees. Taken at 440 mm focal length @ f4.4. This was only a handful of subs because I realized that the Horsehead Nebula was up and cut the timer off.

This was from my (treelimited) yard, which saves packing, travel to and from the observatory and unpacking time. Also, I can take advantage of weather that turns out to be better



than forecast. But when the trees are leafed, only a few spots in the yard can see Polaris for polar alignment.
